Children are supported to learn and understand how to be actively involved in caring for themselves so that they develop a strong sense of responsibility for their own wellbeing alongside caring for others. Our communal rooms enable children of mixed ages to experience this as they play alongside others while developing social skills. Kaiako seek to provide a creative and supportive learning environment that reflects whanaungatanga as they engage in strong, meaningful relationships and high-quality interactions with children and their whanau at all times. This is a key aspect of how we support children to develop social and emotional competence strategies.



In a fast paced ever changing world we believe that it is imperative that children develop **resilience** to be adaptive and able to cope with uncertainty and challenges with optimism. Children will be consistently provided with feedback, encouragement, and acknowledgement to develop the skills that will build a positive sense of self-worth. We actively look for opportunities to develop their language, identity, and culture as individual learners.



Early literacy and numeracy are integrated within the curriculum and reflected in the resources provided. Opportunities to discover and develop different ways to be **creative** and expressive are weaved into our visual arts experiences including imaginative play, storytelling, drama, music and movement. We encourage expressing feelings and ideas using a wide range of materials.
